## Speaker Biographies:

**Kevin Booker:** Kevin Booker has worked for the Sonoma County Water Agency for over fourteen years in the Engineering Planning and Resources Section and the Operations Engineering Section. He has worked on environmental compliance through providing technical support and direction for water, wastewater, recycled water, storm water, and air quality projects/studies. He has been involved with the Sonoma County Water Agency's efforts to increase the use of recycled water in Sonoma County for the past 12 years. He has a Bachelors in Engineering from Chico State University and a Masters in Engineering from Sacramento State University, and holds a professional engineering license.

**Keel Robinson:** Keel is Xylem's North America Water Reuse Leader. Xylem is a leading technology provider for the treatment, test, and transport of water. Keel has a degree in Chemical Engineering from the University of Wisconsin – Madison with over 20 years experience as an equipment manufacturer including developing and implementing new water reuse solutions, some of which he will discuss today. He currently serves as a member of the WateReuse Research Foundation's Research Advisory Committee and was co-chair of the 2015 WateReuse Symposium in Seattle. Keel has lived in the Bay Area for 15 years but is currently in the process of moving to Bend, Oregon with his wife, Lisa, and three boys, Clint, Wyatt, and Shane.

**Ryan Grisso:** Ryan Grisso is the Water Conservation Coordinator for the North Marin Water District. Along with the Water Conservation Program, Ryan also oversees the onsite retrofit projects for recycled water expansion in the Novato Service Area. He has 19 years of experience in water conservation and public relations, working at North Marin Water District and previously at Sonoma County Water Agency and Contra Costa Water District. Ryan has a Bachelor of Science degree in Natural Resource Management from Cal Poly San Luis Obispo.

**Phil Scott:** Phil Scott is a District Manager for West Bay Sanitary District, a collection system district serving Menlo Park, Atherton, Portola Valley and portions of East Palo Alto, Woodside, and portions of San Mateo and Santa Clara counties. Phil started at West Bay Sanitary District in 2010 after previously serving as the Director of Public Works in Ceres, California.
