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## Important 2014 Legislative Dates

January 1 Statues take effect

February 21 Last day for bills to be introduced

June 15
Budget must be passed

June 26 Last day to pass bills for Nov. ballot

August 31 Last day for each house to pass bills

September 30 Last Day for Gov. to sign or veto bills

November 4 General Election & ballot

## **Drought Update**

- Governor's drought declaration on January 17th
  - "Perhaps the worst drought California has seen since records began being kept"
  - Calls for citizens to reduce water use by 20 percent
  - Clear the way for water transfers and exchanges
- Requested administrative measures
  - Implement 2003 Task Force Recommendations
  - Increase \$ or tax rebates to connect to RW
  - Consolidate & expedite permitting
- Proposed Legislation SB 731 Steinberg

## SB 731: Emergency Drought Relief Funding (Steinberg)

- Local Drought Response via IWRMP ~\$472M
- Immediate Relief for Drought-stricken Communities
- Water Supply Benefits form Flood Projects ~ \$100M
- Water & Energy Efficiency for Urban and Ag ~ \$50M
- Sustainable Groundwater Management
- Acceleration of State Agency Actions to Improve Supplies
- Protection of Watersheds, Species, & Landscapes
- Total funding \$644 million

### 2014 Water Bond

- \$11.4 Billion Bond is considered too large
- Require 2/3 vote to change

- Proposed Legislation
  - SB 848 (Wolk) ~ \$6.5B
  - AB 1331 (Rendon) ~ \$6.5B
  - AB 1445 (Logue) ~\$5.8B
  - SB 927 (Cannella/Vidak) ~ \$9.2B

## Drinking Water Reorganization

- Move DPH Drinking Water Programs to SWRCB
- Address DPH capacity & disadvantaged community issues
- CA Drinking Water Reorganization Task Force
- Reorganization in budget proposal
- Anticipate trailer bill to finalize move
- Existing permits protected
- Prohibit RWQCB's from issuing permits

## Title 17 & Title 22 Regulation Update

- Subcommittee
- Timeline
- Suggested revisions:
  - Clarify backflow device requirements
  - Allow swivel ell's
  - Consider additional use of hose bibbs
  - Clarify dual plumed facilities residence vs. HOA

## Federal Legislative Update

- House/Senate bills to address drought
- FY 2014 Omnibus bill passed ~\$1T
  - Increased funding in WaterSMART and Title XVI
  - SRF Funding ~\$2.35B
- Water Resource Development Act (WRDA)
  - No earmarks; prioritize projects with transparent process
  - Authorizes non-federal use of funds to expedite
  - Stalled in conference committee
