Reminder on the Definition of Municipal Recycled Water

Wastewater treated to a specified quality to enable it to be used again. It must be reused:

- Beneficially, in a manner consistent with Title 22
- In accordance with a RWQCB permit (NPDES,WDR, or WRR)








Recycled Water in 2015 UWMPs

- No direct Legislative changes since 2010 UWMPs – except for the standardized reporting requirement
- Modified tables
- Parallel track with 2015
 Recycled Water Survey
- Information provided today is <u>DRAFT</u>





Key Challenges with Recycled Water Data in 2010 UWMPs

- Multiple agencies reported the same recycled water
- Some agencies reported numbers that differed significantly from the 2009 Recycled Water Survey
- Inconsistent boundaries of service areas: wastewater collection, treatment, disposal, reuse, UWMPs




Key Challenges with Recycled Water Data in 2010 UWMPs

- Wide range of what was reported as 'recycled water'
 - Discharge to a river is not recycling
 - Percolation ponds is not groundwater recharge
 - In-plant (WWTP) reuse is considered a beneficial reuse, but is not counted in the survey
 - Pumped groundwater into purple pipe is not recycling




A Quick Look at the Past Recycled Water Surveys

2015 Objectives

- Improve UWMP recycled water reporting
- Conduct a recycled water survey for 2015
- Coordinate, as much as possible, collection of the two data sets





Guidebook Changes to MeetThese Objectives

- Adding a comprehensive appendix focusing on recycled water issues
 - Provides additional discussion on what is to be included in the recycled water section of UWMPs
 - Addresses inconsistencies in 2010 UWMPs
- Proposing modifications to tables, such as additional columns to support survey linkage

UWMP & Survey Coordination

- Different organizations
 - UWMP preparation and RW survey data requests
 - State agencies
- Possible better recycled water understanding across the water spectrum
- The appendix will provide an opportunity to clear up some misconceptions
- Collect better level of treatment data






Proposed Recycled Water Schedule
