WateReuse Association Arizona Section Strategic Plan Revised 10/25/08

WateReuse Mission Statement:

To promote the responsible stewardship of Arizona's water resources through education and advocacy of alternative water supplies.

In addition a "brand" was developed that will become part of the WateReuse logo.

Brand: Sustainable, Beneficial and Efficient

WateReuse Value Statement:

Responsibility: In all that we do

Education: For all

Utilization: Right water for the right use

Sustainability: Social, economic, environmental Efficiency: Optimal use of all water resources

WateReuse Vision Statement:

To be Arizona's authority and advocate that all water has value.

Objectives and Strategies:

- I. To be a recognized leader for the promotion of water reuse in Arizona:
 - A. Increase public awareness of the necessity for and benefits of using the right water for the right use.
 - 1. Publicize examples of successful reuse/reclamation projects.
 - 2. Communicate this message in public meetings and special events.
 - 3. Create educational media and programs.
 - B. Advocate responsible environmental stewardship.
 - 1. Encourage members to reach out to community and environmental organizations to promote water reuse (schools, parks, local industries, etc.).
 - C. Collaborate with other state sections and national organizations on national and regional issues.
 - 1. Host REUSE conferences.
 - 2. Attend and present at state and national symposiums.
 - 3. Past President to be the interstate section liaison.

Action Plan

- 1. Develop a booth to promote reuse with a goal of starting at the 2009 bi-annual conference *Education Committee*.
 - Purchase and create booth.
 - Develop informational packet to hand out.
 - Select Arizona projects/programs to highlight.
 - Booth also to be used at the AZ Water Association annual conference
- 2. Maintain and populate the Arizona WateReuse Section web site *Technical Committee*.
 - Support the position of web content manager to maintain the Arizona State Chapter Section of the National WateReuse website as information is made available.
- 3. Strengthen and improve the organization *Board Members*.
 - Hold an annual strategic planning meeting for Board Members
 - Target January/February 2010 for the annual strategic planning meeting for Board Members and annually thereafter.
 - Produce an annual report.
- II. Monitor and promote or oppose legislation that affects safe and efficient water reuse.
 - A. Support and maintain a legislative committee.

Action Plan:

- 1. Maintain a Legislative Committee *Legislative Committee*.
 - Provide a legislative report to the Board of Directors at each board meeting.
 - Email membership as needed to respond to legislative actions.
- III. Promote the advancement of research and technology in the field of reclaimed water science.
 - A. Participate with other stakeholders and water associations in developing technical expertise and experience.
 - B. Provide funding, in kind services, and scholarships.

Action Plan:

- 1. Maintain an Arizona WateReuse Awards Program Awards Committee.
 - Support an awards program for recognition of successful reuse projects, programs, and individuals to be presented at the state and national conference.
 - Develop and award a student scholarship for research in water reuse for presentation at the 2009 conference.
- 2. Establish priorities for research in the area of water reuse *Technical Committee*.

- Make the Arizona Section available for research project solicitation by universities, federal and state agencies.
- Set aside 15% of annual income for research projects approved by the Board.
- Carry over research funding if not granted in given year.
- Secretary Treasurer to track this fund.
- IV. Provide a forum for discussion of critical water REUSE topics.
 - A. Sponsor a conference highlighting REUSE.
 - B. Create and track a speaker's bureau for community outreach.

Action Plan:

- 1. Plan and coordinate a bi-annual Arizona WateReuse Conference *Conference Committee*.
 - Provide opportunities for poster sessions of successful reuse projects/programs.
 - Solicit speakers for conference presentations.
- 2. Share member program information *Technical Committee and web administrator*.
 - Support the development and implementation of the national WateReuse data base.
 - Provide a link to WateReuse Arizona active member list.
 - Create email addresses for board members, i.e. WateReuse.az.org
- 3. Offer a speaker's bureau to attend meetings and speak on water reuse topics *Education Committee*.
 - Create a list of speakers
 - Develop a generic power point presentation delivering a consistent message.
 - Respond to all requests for speakers in a timely manner
- V. Increase and diversify Arizona Section's membership and participation.
 - A. Foster a proactive membership committee

Action Plan:

- 1. Create a growing level of diverse membership *Membership Committee*.
 - Establish a membership that reflects public, private, and individual members from each region of the State of Arizona.
 - Craft a letter to be signed by the President on why people should join.
 - Generate list of contacts of potential members (new target sectors?) and provide to Board.
 - Board members divide up the list and make personal contacts.
 - Enlist a minimum of 3 new members by November 2009 annual meeting. Estimate of 25 contacts required.
