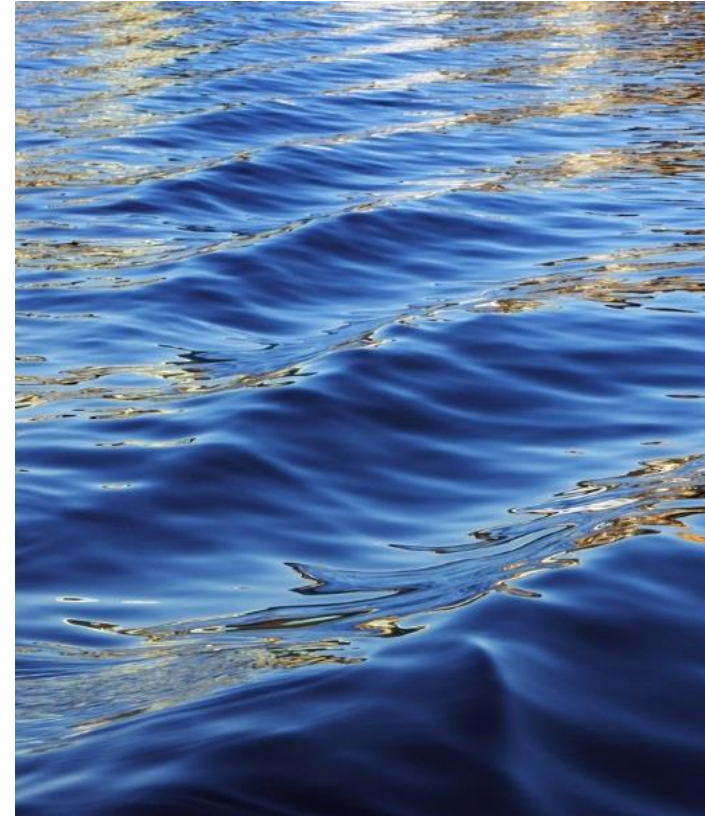

The Full Spectrum

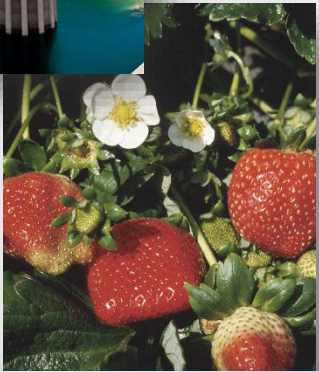

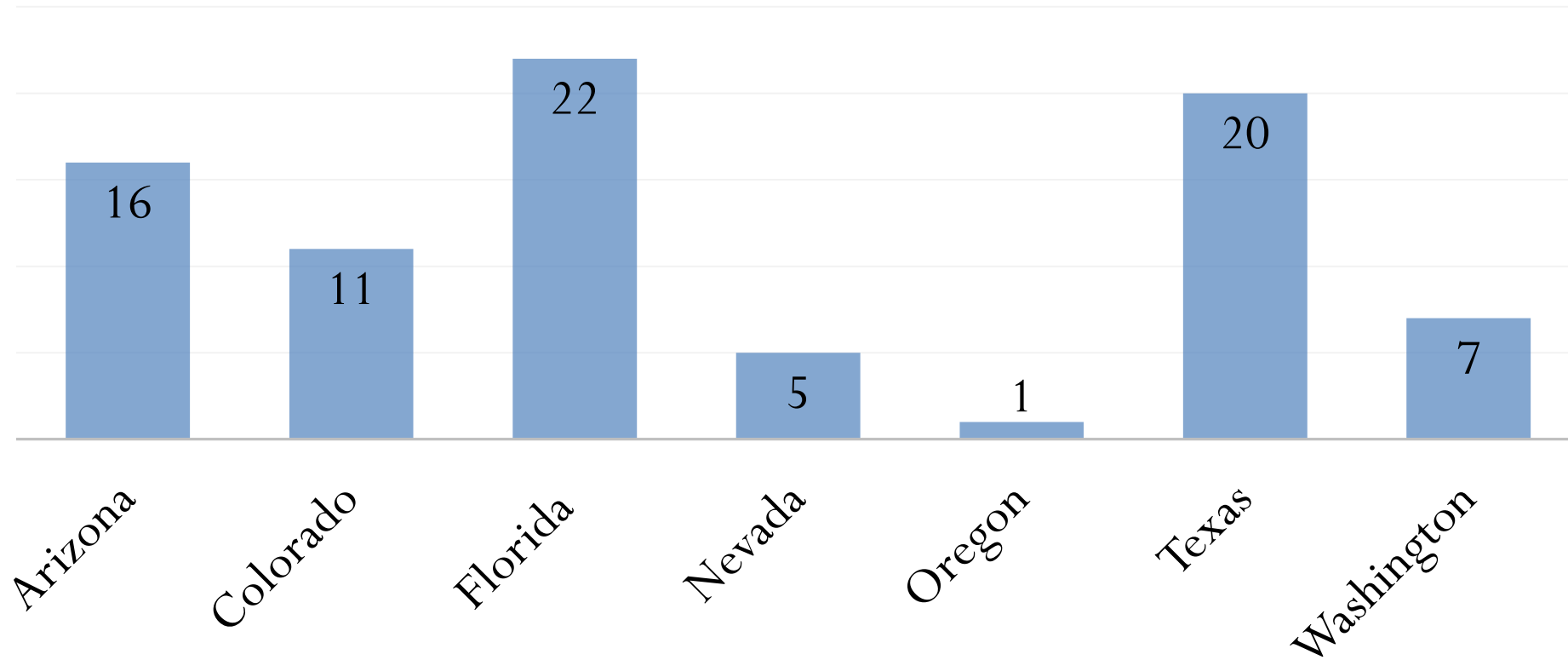

National Advocacy: Federal Priorities

- Funding for Municipal Water Reuse Infrastructure
 - Tax-Exempt Municipal Bonds
 - Title XVI
 - Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (WIFIA)
 - Clean Water State Revolving Fund
 - Drinking Water State Revolving Fund
 - Buy America Procurement Requirements
- Funding for Industrial Water Reuse Infrastructure
 - Investment Tax Credit for Retrofitting Facilities for Recycled Water
- Policy Reform
 - WaterSense
 - Permitting of Potable Reuse



National Advocacy: Success

- Modernizing Title XVI into merit-based competitive grant program.
- Increasing funding for Title XVI.
- Making WIFIA a permanent program.
- Getting \$30 million in new funding for projects under WIFIA.
- Maintaining funding for Clean Water and Drinking Water Revolving Funds.

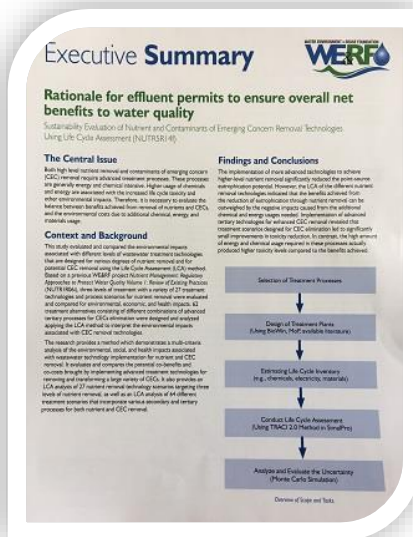

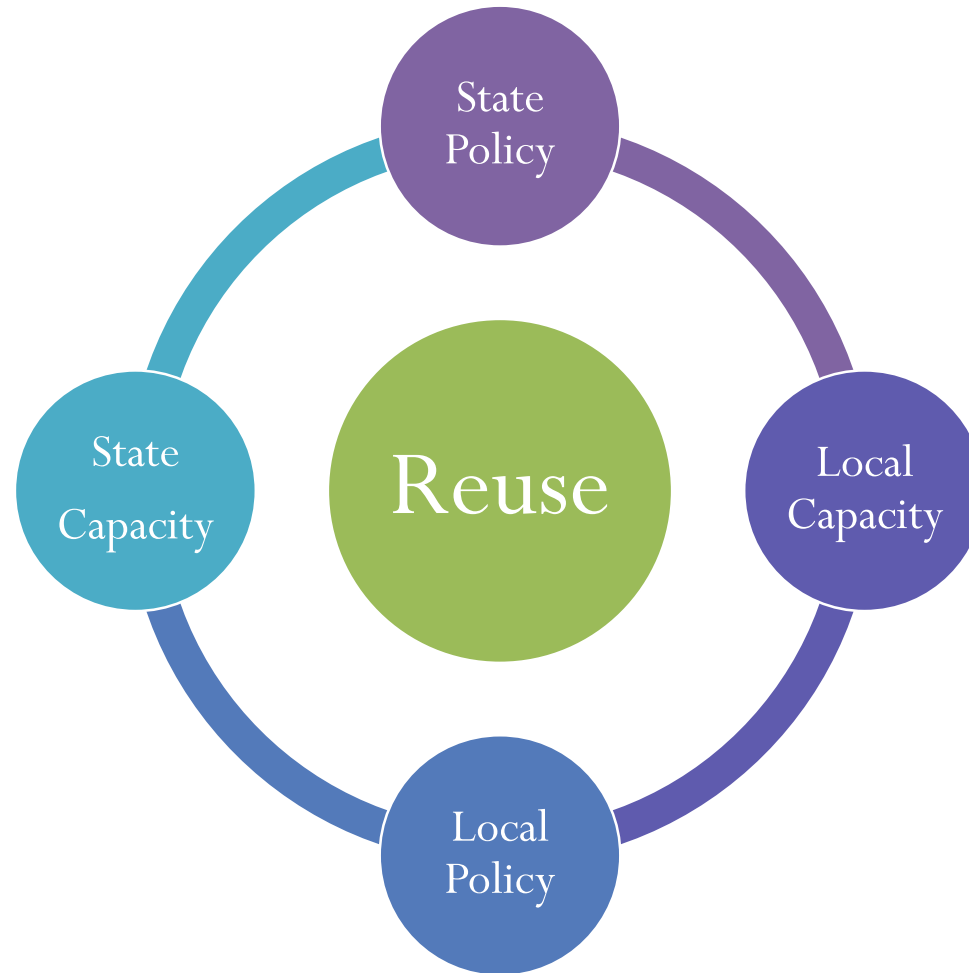

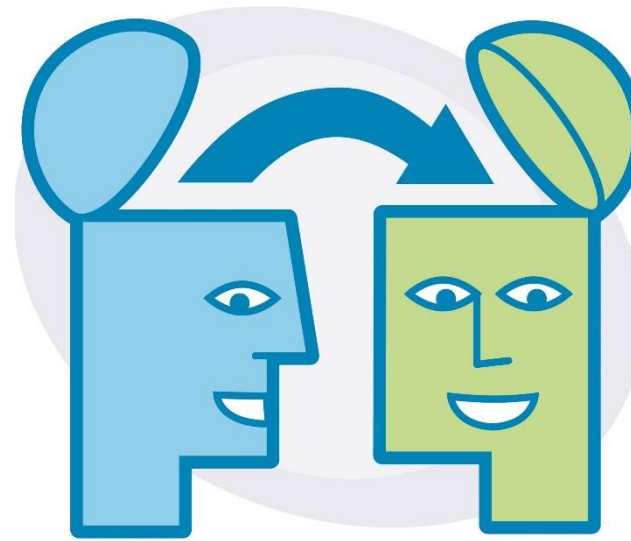
