Membership Meeting

1) Introductions & Welcome (All)

2) WRCO Business Items (Jason A.)

10:10 - 10:25 AM

a) WRCO Treasurer's Report (see attachments)

Kirk gave the financial report. Received some income from membership dues. Put in expense request for gifts for NWRI panel.

b) Approve March 2019 minutes and current financials

Jason reported that we have been posting the minutes to the website. Jason sought to make a motion to approve previous meeting minutes and the financial report, but there was not a quorum. Vote to approve March minutes and May financials will be deferred to future meeting.

c) National Rep update (Donene Dillow)

WRCO bylaws edits have been drafted regarding leadership and progression. National Board has to approve. This will be voted on at the next national Board meeting.

Donene attended national leadership retreat, focused on mission for WRA. Advocates for reuse - funding, legislation, education at all levels (e.g., grade school through legislators).

WRA has entered into an agreement with Project WET - nonprofit focused on training grade school teachers, developing a water reuse track. They are requesting a donation of \$5000 per section by the end of June to support the Kids On Discovery series for water reuse track. AZ and NV sections have already contributed.

Arizona and Nevada Sections have kicked in \$5K each for these educational materials. Group discussion questions what is the value stream and return loop for these educational materials and what is the value added for WRCO and members? Do they need to subscribe to WRA before they were allowed to utilize it?

Donene made a motion for \$2,500 for WRA National, to fund at half the requested ask of \$5,000 to the WET program. Laura seconded the motion and the motion passed.

10:30 - 11:00 AM

i) Eric Dole is reviewing the document and we will discuss at May meeting. Eric will also do a brief summary presentation on the topic.

Presentation by Eric Dole and Judd Sundine presented on various salinity management topics.

Jason posed a question on if we want to continue moving forward with the salinity management discussion and if so, what? Damian suggested a landscape specific document for TDS. Brandi said that CDPHE is aware and concerned about salinity input not just for recycled water, but also for potable waterways.

Group agreed to keep this in mind and work on as projects progress.

Update on April meeting, a lot of progress was made by the NWRI panel.

Laura presented on the NWRI project budget and request for additional funding (presentation and documentation on this as needed).

Laura made a motion that WRCO provides \$20,000 to the Phase 2 NWRI project under the condition that all of the other stakeholder entities are also asked for the additional funding and if the panel is willing to work with us for the workshop at the National Symposium. Bob seconded the motion, motion passed.

a) Regulation 84 new uses update (Brandi Honeycutt)

Brandi reported that we're getting closer to having the edible crops regs finalized, there have been todate 10+ stakeholder meetings.

Hose ownership at particular gardens to ensure that we follow BMPs.

Hemp industry is concerned about heavy metals uptake.

Last rulemaking with the localized water systems – Denver Water and Pike's Peak are moving forward, Brandi and others are developing the applications moving forward.
