Statutes take effect

- Legislature reconvenes
- Last day for bills to be introduced
 - Last day policy comm. to report fiscal bills
 - Last day fiscal comm. to report fiscal bills
 - Last day for bills to pass house of origin
 - Last day to pass budget
 - Last day for any bill to be passed
- Last day for Governor to sign or veto bills

AB 1180: Water: Recycled Water (Friedman)

- Require SWRCB to update uniform criteria for nonpotable uses by 2023 if sufficient funds have been appropriated
- Amend Health and Safety Code to require policy handbook include a provision for use of a swivel or change over device to supply potable water to dual plumbed systems during an interruption of recycled water service; and
- Require use of swivel or changeover device to be consistent with any notification and backflow protection provisions contained in the policy handbook.
- No reimbursement for local agencies for mandated costs
- Last Action: 10/02/19 Signed by Governor
- WRCA is Sponsor
- Policy Handbook Workshop 02/20/2020

Climate Resiliency Bonds

- Governor Newsom's
- SB 45 (Allen)
- AB 352 (E. Garcia)
- AB 1298 (Mullin)

\$4.75 billion bond\$5.5 billion bond\$3.92 billion bond\$ not specified

Need 2/3 vote to get on November 2020 ballot

WateReuse is requesting \$1B for recycled water in bond funding

Constituents of Emerging Concern

- Metropolitan and CMUA cosponsoring CEC proposal
- Establish CEC Drinking Water Program at SWRCB
 - Set up consistent science-based approach for assessing public health of CECs
 - ID highest priority CECs in drinking water for action
 - Filling information gaps and coordinating scientific research
 - Remove barriers and improve timelines for state CEC actions
 - Ensure meaningful stakeholder participation and soliciting broad input
- Introduce bill in coming weeks
- WateReuse proposed amendments
- Expect amendments after 30 days

California Water Resilience Portfolio

- Governor Newsom issued Executive order in April 2019
- State Agencies develop recommendations
- Water Resilience Portfolio released in January 2020
 Goals and Actions include:
 - Maintain and diversify water supplies
 - Protect and enhance natural ecosystems
 - Build connections, and
 - Be prepared

WRCA submitted comment letter February 6, 2020

- Increase CWSRF capacity
- Complete potable reuse regulations by 2023
- Complete Onsite reuse regulations by 2023
- Update non-potable recycled water regulations
- Increase source control for PFAS chemicals

Federal Update

- National Water Reuse Action Plan
 - Comments were due 12/16/19
 - Release final plan 02/27/20; discussion at March 15-17 conference
- FY 2020 Appropriations enacted
 - CWSRF = \$1.638B Aquifer Storage = \$10M
 - ♥ DWSRF = \$1.126B
 - Title XVI = \$63M
 - ♥ WINN = \$20M
 - WIFIA = \$60M

Innovative Water = \$1M

Stormwater reuse = \$25M

Research Program = \$6M

Desalination = \$20M

- FY 2021 initial Appropriations request significantly reduced
- WRDA expected in 2020
- National Water Policy Fly-in Washington D.C. April 27-28, 2020

HR 1162: Water Recycling Investment and Improvement Act (Napolitano)

- Increase \$ for Title XVI
- Increase Title XVI appropriation from \$50M to \$500M
- Increase Title XVI federal funding ceiling from \$20M to \$30M
- Delete funding priority for projects identified by U.S. Drought monitor or as a disaster area for past 4 years
- Make program permanent by removing the WIIN Act Title XVI 2021 expiration date
- Remove the requirement for projects to be specifically name in appropriation legislation.
- Last Action: 06/13/19 Subcommittee Hearings

S. 1932: Drought Resiliency and Water Supply Infrastructure Act (Gardner)

- Surface & Groundwater Storage Authorize \$640M FY 20-24
- Water Recycling and Reuse Authorize \$100M FY 20-24
- Desalination—Authorize \$60M FY 20-24
- Reclamation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Pilot– Authorize \$150M FY 21-25
- De-authorization of Water Recycling Projects
- Last Action: 07/18/19 Subcommittee Hearings

HR 5302: Western Water Recycling and Drought Relief Act (McNerny)

- Amend Title XVI add projects to Congressional Approved list
- Authorize appropriations for 12 projects (11 No. Cal. & 1 HI)
- Limit Federal cost share to 25 percent
- No mention of \$20M funding ceiling
- Last Action: 12/13/19 Introduced legislation

HR XX: FUTURE Drought Resiliency Act (Huffman)

- Furthering Underutilized Technologies and Unleashing Responsible Expenditures (FUTURE) for Drought Resiliency Act
- Incorporate Napolitano's HR 1162 Language
 - Increase Title XVI appropriation from \$50M to \$500M
 - Increase Title XVI federal funding ceiling from \$20M to \$30M
 - Delete funding priority for Drought & disaster areas
 - Removing the WIIN Act Title XVI 2021 expiration date
 - Remove naming requirement in appropriation legislation.
- Incorporate Levin's HR 3723 Desalination Development Act
 - Authorize appropriation of \$260M for FY 2020-2024
- Last Action: 01/08/2020 release legislative package
