To participate in the Ohio State Section, national membership in the WaterReuse Association is required. All of our memberships are organizational and all staff people can access our benefits.

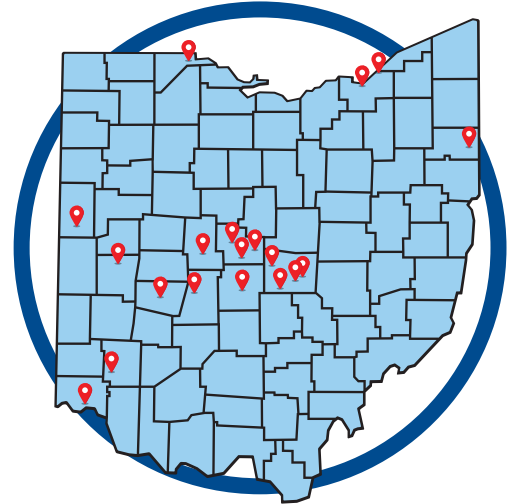
