PFAS Policy and Practice:

The Role of Local Government and Essential Public Services

This briefing will provide an overview of the roles and responsibilities of local governments and essential public service providers in managing media containing per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) while safeguarding public health and the environment. Panelists will discuss the impact of various policies on "passive receivers" of PFAS, including EPA's designation of certain PFAS compounds as "hazardous substances" under CERCLA (i.e., the Superfund law). Representatives from research, state and local governments, public works, solid waste, composting, and wastewater will offer perspectives on the role of passive PFAS receivers.
